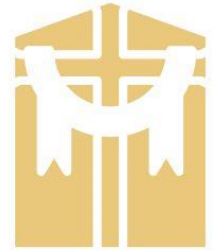

**Please be advised** that services at St. Paul's may be live-streamed and/or recorded.

This practice in no way intends to comment on the state of anyone else's faith; we simply believe our communing together is also a public profession of what we as a congregation teach and confess.

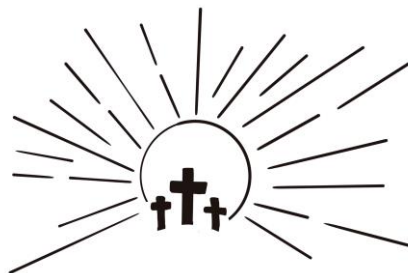
## Confession and Absolution





## The Words of Institution

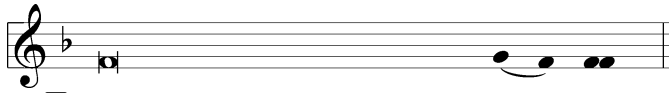

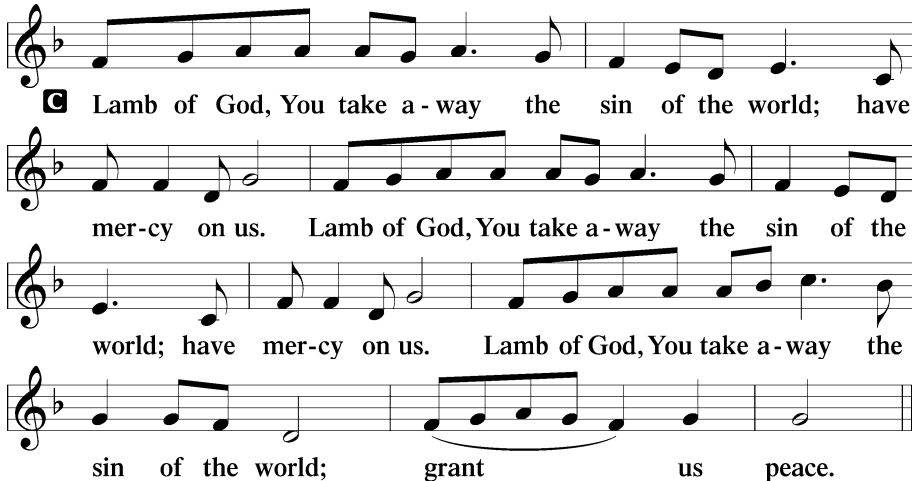

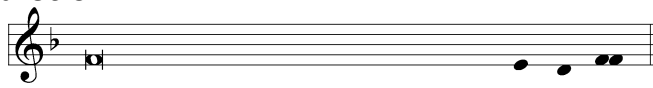
